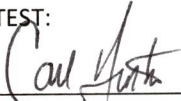
Amending the City of Piedmont Code of Ordinances – Chapter 3 Alcoholic Beverages

Sec. 3.5. Bringing or allowing alcoholic beverages to be brought unto business premises.

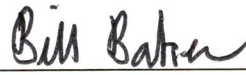
- (a) It shall be unlawful and a violation of this chapter for any person to do anything or commit any act or omission constituting a violation under the state alcoholic beverage control laws, which includes rules or regulations promulgated by the ABC board the violation of which have been denominated by the Chapter 28 of the Code of Ala. 1975, constituting an offense; which laws are incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth.
- (b) *Brown-bagging prohibited.*
- (1) It shall be unlawful for a non-residential business licensed to do business by the City of Piedmont and the respective owners, managers, servants, agents, or employees of any licensed non-residential business, irrespective of whether the business is licensed to sell or furnish alcohol, to allow patrons, customers, invitees, or guests to bring alcoholic beverages onto the premises of the licensed business.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for persons to bring alcoholic beverages onto the premises of a non-residential business licensed to do business by the City of Piedmont, irrespective of whether the business is licensed to sell or furnish alcohol.
- (c) *Exceptions.*
- (1) *Private event.* The prohibitions in subsections (a)(1) and (2), above, shall not apply to alcoholic beverages which are brought on the premises of a private event, party, banquet, seminar, reception, wedding, reunion, fundraiser, or other such occasion where persons enter and attend by invitation of the host.
