The City Council of the City of Piedmont met in regular session at the time and on the date above. Present were Mayor Bill Baker, Council Members Ben Keller, Mary Bramblett, Doug Dickeson, Matt Rogers, Greg South, Bobby Hardin and Terry Kiser.

Following the invocation given by Doug Dickeson and the pledge of allegiance to the flag the minutes were presented for consideration. Terry Kiser made the motion that the minutes be approved as presented. Matt Rogers seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

The bills totaling \$80,856.40 were then presented for consideration for payment. Mary Bramblett made the motion that the bills be approved as presented. Ben Keller seconded the motion and the bills were approved unanimously.

In Other Business Terry Kiser recognized members of the Dailey Street Baptist Church that were at the meeting to present the Piedmont Police Department with gift cards for a token of appreciation for the work that they do every day.

Doug Dickeson made a motion to pour a five foot wide sidewalk at the new Roberts House location in exchange for an easement to the property where the city fiber lines are located. Terry Kiser seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Doug Dickeson said that repairs needed to be made at the cemetery and for the Council to look over the animal control information he handed out.

Matt Rogers had no report.

Terry Kiser thanked the Mayor for getting a portion of Riddle Ave. paved.

In the Mayor's Comments he informed the Council that a school board appointment needed to be made at the next meeting.

He announced opening day of baseball at the Piedmont Sports Complex on April 8<sup>th</sup>.
