The City Council of the City of Piedmont met in regular session at the time and on the date above. Present were Mayor Bill Baker, Council Members Ben Keller, Mary Bramblett, Doug Dickeson, Greg South, Bobby Hardin and Terry Kiser. Matt Rogers was absent from the meeting.

Following the invocation given by Mayor Baker and the pledge of allegiance to the flag the minutes were presented for consideration. Terry Kiser made the motion that the minutes be approved as presented. Ben Keller seconded the minutes and the minutes were approved unanimously.

The bills for payment totaling \$299,377.04 were then presented for consideration for payment. Mary Bramblett made the motion that the bills be approved as presented. Doug Dickeson seconded the motion and the bills were approved for payment unanimously.

In Council Reports Ben Keller had no report.

Mary Bramblett thanked the DAV for the Memorial Day Service.

Doug Dickeson had no report.

Greg South asked the Council to consider splitting the emergency fund in to two different accounts for big emergencies.

Bobby Hardin had no report.

Terry Kiser asked Chief Norton to speak about the need for new police cars. He also asked that the city start on the new pavilion at the Memorial Park.

Mary Bramblett made the motion to allow Chief Norton to purchase 1 new police car for \$34,892.80 and 1 admin car for \$24,046.14 for the police department. Administrative vehicle is a 2019 Dodge Charger SXT and the patrol car is a 2019 Dodge Charger. Doug Dickeson seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

In the Mayor's Comments the Mayor said the DAV did an outstanding job with the Memorial Day Service. He also asked for a motion to reappoint Matt Rogers to be the City's AMEA representative. Mary Bramblett made the motion to reappoint Matt Rogers as the AMEA representative. Terry Kiser seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

With no other business to come before the Council Doug Dickeson made the motion that the meeting be adjourned. Terry Kiser seconded the motion and the meeting adjourned at 6:30 pm.
