The City Council of the City of Piedmont met in regular session at the time and on the date above. Present were Mayor Baker, Council Members John Lawrence, Richard Williams, Jubal Feazell, Caleb Pope, Greg South, David Ivey, and Terry Kiser.

Following the invocation given by David Ivey and the pledge of allegiance given by Mayor Baker, the minutes were presented for consideration. David Ivey spoke about work orders that have been completed.

Clerk Hinton told the Council that he should have a report on the purchase and selling of natural gas by the end of the month. He also reported to Council that Avenu collections were now listed on the account balance sheet that is included in the packet.

In the Mayor's comments he thanked Jon Garlick for attending the Council Meeting. He is running for probate judge. He also wanted to thank Jeff Formby for attending the meeting.
